Are you serious or seriously?

Serious is an adjective and is modified by the adverb, more, when serious is used comparatively. Seriously is an adverb, modified by the same adverb when it is used comparatively. In a sentence, serious must define a noun or pronoun; seriously must define a verb. "He was more serious about winning than his partner."

Are currently or currently are?

they are both 'correct'. Neither is better than the other. Only the first sentence is grammatically correct because there's a grammar rule to use adverbs after the verb 'to be'. He currently is directing TV sitcoms.

Are as followed?

The correct phrase is "are as follows." This phrase is usually followed by a colon, which indicates that more information is forthcoming.

Are how and why the same?

In my opinion, when "why" and "how" are interchangeable they always mean "how". And "how" is a question about the behavior of a process or the cause behind a series of events. When they are not interchangeable, "why" is a question about meaning of something, or justification for a conscious choice someone made.

Are you available or will you be available?

Both are equally grammatically correct. However, the "would" version asks for the person's forethought and willingness to be available, while the "will" version casts that aside and straightforwardly asks for the person's availability. I would say that "Would you be available?" is an invitation or polite inquiry.

Are you going or will you go?

'are you going' is used much more often than 'will you go' presumably by native speakers of English, and this is true for both American and British English. We use "going to" for planned activities, and "will" for promises and predictions.

Are a few or is a few?

'a few' of anything is a small number. It is greater than one, and thus refers to a plural quantity, thus 'are' is the correct verb form.

Are you done mean?

"Are you done" is used when asking a person if he or she has finished doing something. The thing that is being done is known. ... "Have you done" is asked when the thing being done is not known, and the person is inquiring as to what the thing is.

Are you going to or will you?

When you're talking about actions that you will do soon (tomorrow or next week), use GOING TO. When you want to ask/request for something, use WILL. When you're expecting/anticipating something to happen, use GOING TO. Finally, when you promise something, use WILL!

Are you going to or too?

To is a preposition with several meanings, including "toward" and "until." Too is an adverb that can mean "excessively" or "also." Just to be clear: two is pronounced the same as to and too, but it can't be used instead of either of them because it's a number.

What is the difference between 0 1 and 0?

[0,1] is the set of numbers between 0 and 1, including 0 and including 1. (It's the set of numbers for which " $0 \leq x \leq 1$ " is true.) [0,1) is the set of numbers between 0 and 1, including 0 but not including 1. (It's the set of numbers for which

" $0 \leq x < 1$ " is true.)

What does Siri say when you say what is 0 divided by 0?

What does 1st and down mean?

When downs are described the number of the down is followed by how many yards are left to go. So the typical first down will be described as "first and ten". This means it is first down and there are 10 yards to go to get the next first down.

Why is it called first down?

Getting lots of first downs usually translates to more scoring opportunities, which are definitely good things. Football has its own lingo to explain the offense's progress toward a first down. A first down situation is also known as a "first and 10" because the offense has 10 yards to go to gain a first down.

What makes a first down?

noun Football. the first of four consecutive plays during which an offensive team must advance the ball at least ten yards to retain possession of it. a gain of ten or more yards by an offensive team that entitles it to continued possession for a new series of downs.

What is 2nd down?

2nd down in football is the second of four downs in the down cycle. If the offense doesn't reach the 1st down marker on the 1st down, it then becomes 2nd down. 3rd down comes after 2nd down if the offense does not reach the 1st down line on 2nd down.

What does it mean to be under something?

(Entry 1 of 3) 1 : in or into a position below or beneath something. 2 : below or short of some quantity, level, or limit \$10 or under —often used in combination understaffed. 3 : in or into a condition of subjection, subordination, or unconsciousness put the patient under for surgery.

What does sending me under mean?

send under To cause someone or something to move underneath something, as by pushing, kicking, propelling, etc.
