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Are vs sore Japanese?

When you want to talk about things you do not know the name of, you can use such expressions as kore, sore, are, and dore. Kore refers to something close to the speaker; sore refers to something close to the person you're talking to; are refers to an object that is neither close to the speaker or the listener.

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How do you address a woman in Japanese?

In Japanese, "~ san (~さん)" is a title of respect added to a name. It can be used with both male and female names, and with either surnames or given names. It can also be attached to the name of occupations and titles.

How do you say girlfriend in Japanese?

It's the same in Japanese. If you're already talking about a woman, it's likely that 'kanojo' means 'she'. If, however, 'kanojo' comes out of nowhere, it probably means 'girlfriend'.

What is the polite way to say you in Japanese?

Anata (あなた) – While this is technically the default, polite way to say 'you' in Japanese, it's still better to get into the habit of referring to people by their surname and honorific just in case. It's worth noting that this form of the word is often used by women towards their spouses.

What does Hada mean in Japanese?

Hada, and another variant pronunciation Haneda, both written with characters meaning 'wings' and 'rice paddy', are found predominantly in eastern Japan.

What is the Japanese word for die?

The usage of the simple word for “to die,” 死ぬ (shinu), can differ slightly from that in English.

What is OK called in Japanese?

The word 大丈夫(だいじょうぶ) daijoubu literally means “fine, alright”. So this phrase means you're fine with whatever

was said before. You can use it to mean “OK” in Japanese.

How do you respond to Genki desu ka?

The common response is always “Hai, Genki Desu!”, usually given with enthusiasm of varying degrees because the response is always positive to this short phrase. The Japanese do not give medical information, and it is not desired by the person giving you such a greeting to get a run down of how you really feel.

What Daijoubu means?

daijoubu desu = i'm fine, i'm alright, it's ok.. (you reply back to someone or that someone asking you) daijoubu desu ka? = are you alright?, are you okay? (

Is it rude to say arigato?

' is a little bit rude. It would be better to use 'Arigato. ' when you say “Thanks” to your friends.

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
