When did the feudal system end?

Feudalism was a political, economic and social system that established itself in Western Europe with the Carolingian Empire (IX century) and with the death of Charlemagne. The official abolition of feudalism took place in 1806 by Napoleon Bonaparte, more than three centuries after the end of the Middle Ages.

When did feudalism in England end?

In the later medieval period, feudalism began to diminish in England with the eventual centralization of government that began around the first quarter of the fourteenth century, and it remained in decline until its eventual abolition in England with the Tenures Abolition Act 1660.

What caused the end of feudalism?

The reasons for the decline of Feudalism during the Medieval period of the Middle Ages included: The Crusades and travel during the Middle Ages opened new trade options to England. ... More trade saw the growth of more towns. Peasants moved away from the country into towns they were eventually allowed to buy their freedom.

The plague that caused the Black Death originated in China in the early to mid-1300s and spread along trade routes westward to the Mediterranean and northern Africa. It reached southern England in 1348 and northern Britain and Scandinavia by 1350.

In 1666 the Great Fire of London destroyed much of the centre of London, but also helped to kill off some of the black rats and fleas that carried the plague bacillus. Bubonic Plague was known as the Black Death and had been known in England for centuries.
