Brahmins: The word Brahmin translates to "Supreme Self" or the first of the gods. Brahmin is the highest Varna in Vedic Hinduism. The population of India that is considered a member of the Brahmin caste according to the article "The Joshua project" is about 60,481,000 people.

### Where did Brahmins come from?

The elevated position of the Brahmins goes back to the late Vedic period, when the Indo-European-speaking settlers in northern India were already divided into Brahmins (or priests), warriors (of the Kshatriya class), traders (of the Vaishya class), and labourers (of the Shudra class).

### Who is a real Brahmin?

A TRUE Brahmin is one who has acquired brahminhood not by birth but through his noble actions. He who has gained Supreme Self-knowledge is a Brahmin. Vedas and Epics proclaim that there is no caste differentiation in the Brahminic State.
