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Does polyester dye easily?

Polyester is an extremely difficult type of fabric to dye, especially if the garment is 100% polyester. This is because polyester is a synthetic fabric made from petroleum, and due to the manufacturing process, it is essentially plastic.

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Which fabric absorbs dye the best?

Natural fibers are great absorbers. Nylon (the first synthetic fabric), has a unique chemistry from other synthetics, that lets it absorb dye as well!


Why do different fabrics dye differently?

It was hypothesized that there would be significant variation across the different fabrics in terms of absorption of the dye, that the natural fabrics would absorb the dye more effectively than the synthetic fibers, and that the cotton would bond the best with the dye overall.

What fabric is hardest to dye?


Wool consistently developed the most intense colors with all of the dyes. Nylon, cotton, and acetate were also relatively easy to dye. Polyester was the most difficult fabric to dye.





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
