[Letitia Christian Tyler](#), first wife of President [John Tyler](#), served as First Lady of the [United States](#) from 1841 until her death at 51. She was the youngest First Lady to pass away and one of only three to have passed away in the White House.

Frances Clara Folsom Cleveland became the youngest First Lady at age 21 as the first woman to marry a president in the White House. She served as the 23rd and 25th First Lady of the United States while married to President Grover Cleveland.

Conclude with publication information for the book. Place a period after the last page number. A standard MLA citation includes: Last Name, First Name. "Title of Article." Title of Book, edited by First Name Last Name. Publisher, year, pp.

Which president has nominated the most justices?

George Washington holds the record for most Supreme Court nominations, with 14 nominations (12 of which were confirmed). Making the second-most nominations were Franklin D. Roosevelt and John Tyler, with nine each (all nine of Roosevelt's were confirmed, while only one of Tyler's was).

Who is the first vice president to become president?

John Tyler became the tenth President of the United States (1841-1845) when President William Henry Harrison died in April 1841. He was the first Vice President to succeed to the Presidency after the death of his predecessor.

Which US presidents were never elected?

Four Members — John Tyler, Millard Fillmore, Andrew Johnson, and Gerald Ford — were never elected to the Presidency, having succeeded a President who died or resigned. Only Gerald Ford was never successfully elected as either President or Vice President, though he served in both positions.
