The Catholic Church teaches that Christ set up only "one true Church", and that this Church of Christ is and subsists only in the Catholic Church. ... Catholic belief holds that the Church "is the continuing presence of Jesus on earth", and that all duly-consecrated bishops have a lineal succession from the apostles.

Why did the Catholic religion start?

According to Catholic tradition, the Catholic Church was founded by Jesus Christ. ... The Catholic Church teaches that the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles, in an event known as Pentecost, signaled the beginning of the public ministry of the Church.

Which religions do not eat meat on Fridays during Lent?

The Catholic Church instructs members to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Fridays during Lent, a season of penitence and renewal leading up to Easter. The practice of forgoing meat dates to the early Church, when meat was considered a luxury, and is meant to be an act of self-discipline.

What does Huguenot mean?

Huguenots were French Protestants who held to the Reformed, or Calvinist, tradition of Protestantism. The term has its origin in early-16th-century France. It was frequently used in reference to those of the Reformed Church of France from the time of the Protestant Reformation.

Which was a common feature of Renaissance literature?

One key characteristic of the Renaissance was the idea of the divine right of kings to rule. Another was the development of humanistic ideas, such as the dignity of man. It was a time of scientific inquiry and exploration. This was also the time of the Protestant Reformation, and the invention of the printing press.

Is Eucharist a Catholic term?

Today, "the Eucharist" is the name still used by Eastern Orthodox, Oriental Orthodox, Catholics, Anglicans, Presbyterians, and Lutherans. Other Protestant denominations rarely use this term, preferring either "Communion", "the Lord's Supper", "Remembrance", or "the Breaking of Bread".
