How do you use what you know?

"You know what?" is generally used during conversation when you want to change the direction or topic of discussion. It is usually said abruptly and followed by a statement with a tone of finality. You know what? All this sad talk is making me want to cry.

How many does many mean?

How do you use let alone?

Let alone is used after a statement, usually a negative one, to indicate that the statement is even more true of the person, thing, or situation that you are going to mention next. It is incredible that the 12-year-old managed to even reach the pedals, let alone drive the car.

How is he or how he is?

"How was he?" = How was he doing specifically at the time you saw him. "How is he?" = How is he doing in general. (This is what people usually want to know, so this is what you'll usually hear.)

How many is a few?

While many people would agree that "a few" means three or more, the actual dictionary definition of "a few" is, "not many but more than one." So, "a few" cannot be one, but it can be as low as two.

How many is several?

By definition, several means three or more (but often less than many, which we will cover next.) So, if several party-goers out of a group of nine were intoxicated, several could correctly be translated as three or four.

How do you use as far as?

Used as a conjunction, "as far as" means "to the degree or extent that." It therefore qualifies statements that apply only under certain conditions. The phrases like "as far as we know," for instance, signals that something is based on incomplete information: The experiment poses no risk as far as we know.

How do you use way back?

"way back" is an idiomatic expression for "long time ago", short for "a long way back in time". For example: "When did you meet Joe for the first time?" "That was way back when I still was a teenager". In your case, you are using by coincidence the word "way" followed by the word "back".

How do you use than?

Than is used in comparisons as a conjunction, as in "she is younger than I am," and as a preposition, "he is taller than me." Then indicates time. It is used as an adverb, "I lived in Idaho then," noun, "we'll have to wait until then," and adjective, "the then governor."

How is being used?

It can be used as a gerund, or in present or past continuous tenses. In a present or past continuous tense, being says that it is happening now, or was happening before, in a continual manner. ... Being can also be used as a gerund, a word that acts like a noun and looks like a verb.

How do you do vs how are you?

They mean the same thing, but "How do you do?" is more formal and reserved for the first time you meet someone. "How are you doing?" is more casual and could be used at introduction, but generally is used when you are fairly familiar with a peer.

What does ☐ mean in texting?
