### What animal products are in toothpaste?

Not all toothpastes are vegan, and many traditional brands on the market contain animal ingredients. These include animal-based glycerin, calcium phosphate that has been extracted from bone char, and bee-derived products like propolis, which is a common ingredient found in natural toothpastes on the market.

### Is toothpaste made out of pork?

Fatty acids extracted from the bone fat of pigs are used in shampoos and conditioners to give them their shiny, pearl-like appearance. These acids can also be found in a number of body lotions, foundations and anti-wrinkle creams. Glycerine made from pork fat is also an ingredient in many types of toothpaste.

### Does toothpaste have gelatin?

All Colgate Toothpastes and Toothbrushes that are marketed in the U.S., with the exception of Colgate Wisp and Colgate Max Fresh with Mouthwash Beads, are free of any animal-derived ingredients.

### What products contain pork?

Products like Doritos, Cheetos, Welch's grape jelly, Dunkin' donuts, Crest toothpaste, McDonald's apple pies, and gummy bears contain pig enzymes.
