At what point does afternoon become evening?

Therefore, afternoon is from 12:01 pm to 5:59 pm. Evening is from 6:00 pm until midnight. "The word "afternoon", which derives from "after" and "noon", has been attested from about the year 1300; Middle English contained both "afternoon" and the synonym "aftermete".

What does Wanned mean?

Suggestive or indicative of weariness, illness, or unhappiness; melancholy: a wan expression. intr.v. wanned, wan·ning, wans. To become pale. [Middle English, pale, gloomy, from Old English wann, gloomy, dark.]

When did learnings become a word?

Usage notes The term learnings was not in common use in the 19th and 20th century, though the countable noun sense learning ("thing learned") dates to Middle English (14th century; see leornyng), and the plural learnings to Early Modern English.

What metal is Sauter?

Solder (, or in North America) is a fusible metal alloy used to create a permanent bond between metal workpieces. The word solder comes from the Middle English word soudur, via Old French solduree and soulder, from the Latin solidare, meaning "to make solid".

Does Grand mean old?

Middle English from Old French grant, grand, from Latin grandis 'full-grown, big, great'.

What is the meaning of Jenner?

English (chiefly Kent and Sussex): occupational name for a designer or engineer, from a Middle English reduced form of Old French engineor 'contriver' (a derivative of engaigne 'cunning', 'ingenuity', 'stratagem', 'device').

What does the name Fletcher mean?

Fletcher is a surname of English, Scottish, and Irish origin. The name is an occupational name for an arrowsmith or seller of arrows, derived from the Middle English, Old English "Fulcher" or Old French flech(i)er (in turn from Old French fleche "arrow").

What does Noel really mean?

A term signifying the holiday season, Noël comes to us from the Latin verb nasci, meaning "to be born." In the book of Ecclesiastes, the birth of Jesus is called natalis. A variation of this word, nael, made its way into Old French as a reference to the Christmas season and later into Middle English as nowel.

Is ist a Greek or Latin suffix?

[Middle English -iste, from Old French, from Latin -istes, -ista, from Greek -istes, agent n. suff.]

What is a poke in the South?

(pōk) Chiefly Southern US. A sack; a bag. [Middle English, probably from Old North French; see pocket.] Word History: A pig in a poke is a colorful vernacular expression used to describe something offered in a manner that conceals its true nature or value.






































