What does the phrase push the envelope mean?

Pushing the envelope means testing limits and trying out new, often radical ideas. The expression comes originally from mathematics and engineering, where an envelope is a boundary, but was popularized by test pilots (especially those depicted in [Tom Wolfe's book The Right Stuff](#)).

What does push the line mean?

phrasal verb. When someone pushes in, they unfairly join a queue or line in front of other people who have been waiting longer.

What does Pushing Daisies mean?

: to be dead We'll all be pushing up daisies by the time the government balances the budget.
