What is a rifle used for?

The rifle has a long barrel with rifling and thick walls to withstand high pressures. Rifling puts a spiral spin on a bullet fired from a rifle, increasing accuracy and distance. Rifles are typically used for firing at stationary targets. The bore of a rifle barrel is made for only one specific caliber of ammunition.

Rifle-like weapons with a barrel length of less than 20 inches are typically considered to be carbines. Weapons with barrels greater than 20 inches are usually called rifles unless specifically called carbines by the manufacturer. By this definition, many so-called "Assault Rifles" would technically be carbines.

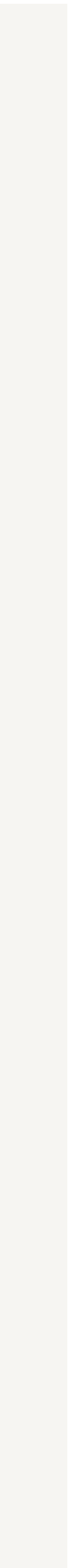
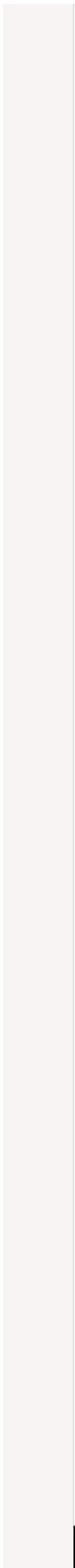
