### What is made from animal fat?

Wet-rendered lard, from pork fatback. Animal fats are commonly consumed as part of a western diet in their semi-solid form as either milk, butter, lard, schmaltz, and dripping or more commonly as filler in factory produced meat, pet food and fast-food products. ...

### Why is there animal fat in soap?

Soaps like Dove are all tallow with oil added to them to reduce the drying effect that soaps have on the skin. Animal fats are not essential to the soap-making process.

## How is soap made from fat?

The production of toilet soaps usually entails saponification of triglycerides, which are vegetable or animal oils and fats. An alkaline solution (often lye or sodium hydroxide) induces saponification whereby the triglyceride fats first hydrolyze into salts of fatty acids. Glycerol (glycerin) is liberated.








