What is the origin of have a good one?

Have a Good One -- What?

“Have a good one,” at first, was always used in context. If someone said, “I’m having a party”, the other person would say, “have a good one”, meaning “have a good party.” Or if someone said they were going to play a game of tennis, then “have a good one” would mean “have a good game of tennis”.

What does the phrase 'have a good one' mean?

This is a very popular phrase in Australia! It usually means ‘have a good day’ but may sometimes apply to other activities. Sometimes it can be a bit ambiguous. For example: Bob: “See you tomorrow. I’m going over to Dave’s for a beer.” Kevin: “OK. Have a good one!”
