Why is a number multiplied by zero?

The multiplication property of zero: Regardless of what the other number is, multiplying by zero always results in an answer of zero. ... Any two numbers whose sum is zero are additive inverses of one another. For example, if you add - 5 to 5, you arrive at zero. So -5 and 5 are additive inverses of one another.

Why does anything multiplied by zero equal zero?

Any number multiplied by zero is equal to zero. Think of it this way - if you have 13 lots of zero, you still have zero. However many lots of zero you have, you have zero.

RELATED QUESTIONS

What happens when you multiply by 0?

Multiplication by Zero What happens when you multiply a number by 0? Multiplying by 0 makes the product equal zero. The product of any real number and 0 is 0.

How do you explain multiplying by zero?

If multiplication tells you how many times to add a certain number, then multiplying by 0 means that you have nothing to add because 0 means nothing. So, 3 * 0 means that you are adding 3 zero, or no, times.





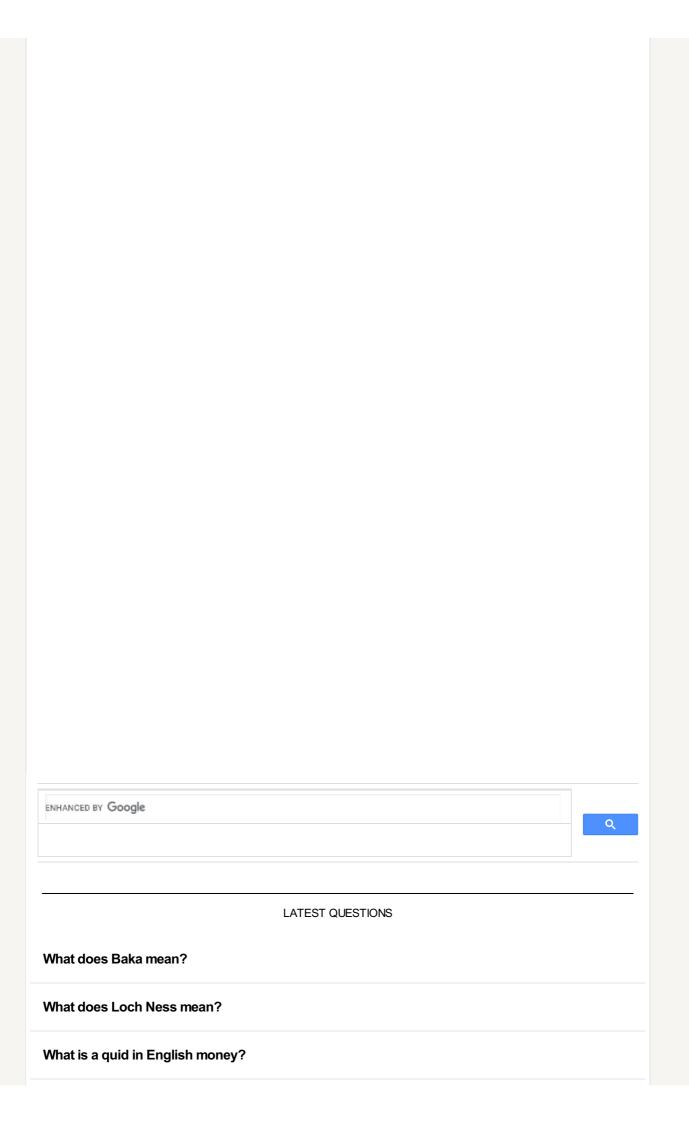
