Olive Garden is a bad restaurant because most of their food is not really classic Italian food. It is a farce. Their dishes have been americanized and lie to the populace. There is no "Spaghetti and Meatballs", that is an american adulteration of real Italian food.

Cheerios were invented by Lester Borchardt and a team of people at General Mills in 1941. At that time, they not only invented the cereal, but they also had to invent a machine that could be used to create puffed cereal like puffed wheat.

### Is Cheerios owned by Nestle?

Cereal Partners Worldwide — a partnership that results in Cheerios being sold under the Nestlé brand in Europe — is a solid contributor to General Mills' bottom line. ... But globally, Kellogg has a 30 percent share, and General Mills — through Cereal Partners Worldwide or by itself — has 18 percent.

### Are Lucky Charms being discontinued?

Lucky Charms to retire one of its brightest marshmallows General Mills announced Friday that the hourglass-shaped marshmallows will be discontinued starting in the spring, People magazine reported. ... Last May, consumers with a real sweet tooth got to sample marshmallow-only boxes of the cereal.

### What in Cheerios is bad for you?

Are Cheerios and Nature Valley products safe to eat? The EWG considers any cereal with a glyphosate level of more than 160 parts per billion to be unsafe. ... In a statement, General Mills — which produces Cheerios, Nature Valley, and Fiber One products — said its top priority is food safety.

### Is General Mills owned by Nestle?

The General Mills-Nestlé partnership has 17 factories worldwide and does business in 130 countries.

#### What do Cheerios smell like?

The General Mills plant in Buffalo, NY, produces the east coast's Cheerios, and residents claim the whole city smells like the cereal. If you're plugging your nose at the thought of a stale, cardboard stench, think again: Apparently, the fresh-baked stuff smells like "cupcakes with oat-like notes."

### Are Bugles bad?

Bugles. What's so bad about Bugles? The highly saturated coconut oil that General Mills fries them in- oil that's about twice as saturated as lard. ... One serving (just over a cup) of these fried wonders will give you 40% of your daily limit of saturated fat.

## Who is General Mills owned by?

General Mills has a joint partnership with Häagen-Dazs Japan, a company that was sold to Pillsbury in 1983 and acquired by General Mills when Pillsbury was purchased in 2001.
